














Guide for sorting and disposing of recyclable resources and waste

Sorting refuse into five types and 13 classes

<h3>① Newspapers</h3>  <p>Newspapers and inserts</p> <p>Tie with string in a criss-cross fashion. Do not put them in a plastic or paper bag.</p>	<h3>② Cardboard</h3>  <p>Corrugated cardboard boxes</p> <p>After removing adhesive tapes and other foreign materials, fold flat and tie with string in a criss-cross fashion (follow this procedure even when disposing of only one box).</p>	<h3>③ Magazines and other items of paper</h3>  <p>Magazines, paper boxes, envelopes, etc.</p> <p>Tie magazines with string in a criss-cross fashion.</p> <p>Put other items in a paper bag after removing staples or the like, and tie the bag with string in a criss-cross fashion. If you do not have a paper bag on hand, put them in a transparent or semi-transparent plastic bag.</p>	<h3>④ Paper drink packs</h3>  <p>Cartons for milk, juice and so on that are white inside</p> <p>Rinse the inside lightly, then cut open and dry the carton.</p> <p>Tie them together with string in a criss-cross fashion. Alternatively, put them in a transparent or semi-transparent plastic bag.</p>
<h3>⑤ Cloth</h3>  <p>Clothes such as shirts and cloths such as towels</p> <p>Wash and fold without removing the zippers and buttons.</p> <p>Put them in a transparent or semi-transparent bag.</p> <p>※Do not put the bag out for collection on rainy days.</p>	<h3>⑥ Glass bottles and cans</h3>  <p>Bottles and cans for beverages, food and medicines and cosmetics bottles</p> <p>Rinse the inside lightly and remove tops made of metal, plastic, cork and so on.</p> <p>Put bottles and cans together in a transparent or semi-transparent plastic bag.</p> <p>※Broken bottles are also acceptable.</p>	<h3>⑦ PET bottles</h3>  <p>Bottles bearing the PET mark for beverages, specified seasonings, etc.</p> <p>Remove caps and labels. Then rinse the inside and flatten each bottle. No need to remove a ring around the mouth of the bottle.</p> <p>Put them in a transparent or semi-transparent plastic bag.</p>	<h3>⑧ White styrofoam trays</h3>  <p>White and plain trays for meat, fish, prepared food and so on</p> <p>Rinse lightly and dry.</p> <p>Put them in a transparent or semi-transparent plastic bag.</p>
<h3>⑨ Plastic containers / wrapping</h3>  <p>Plastic containers and wrapping that become unnecessary once the contents have been consumed or removed.</p> <p>Look for this mark.</p>		<p>For bags for candies or the like, shake crumbs out. No need to wash inside.</p> <p>For dirty items, rinse the inside lightly to remove any residue.</p> <p>※Items that are difficult to empty and clean are treated as combustible waste.</p> <p>Remove caps or pumps on bottles and so on.</p> <p>Put them together in a transparent or semi-transparent plastic bag. Do not put a garbage bag in another one.</p> <p>※Make sure that garbage bags are not blown off on a windy day by taking such measures as covering them with a net.</p>	
<h3>Combustible waste</h3> <p>Combustible items smaller than 50 cm</p>	<h3>Incombustible waste</h3> <p>Incombustible items smaller than 50 cm</p> <p>Wednesday</p>	<h3>Hazardous waste</h3> <p>Mercury, explosive articles and sharp objects</p>	<h3>Bulky waste</h3> <p>Items longer than 50 cm and shorter than 2.5 m and those weighing up to 100 kg</p> <p>Either carry waste to a waste disposal center (free of charge), or ask for collection (charged).</p>
 <p>Kitchen waste Paper diapers Non-recyclable paper CDs and videos Trimmed tree branches shorter than 50 cm</p> <p>○Drain off water from kitchen waste. ○Flush excretions in paper diapers down the toilet.</p> <p>Put them in a transparent or semi-transparent plastic bag. ※Bundle tree branches together with string into a bunch that can be carried with one hand.</p>	 <p>Small home appliances Pots and kettles China Glassware Cans measuring 20 cm or larger Umbrellas</p> <p>○Empty out paint cans and so on. Put them in a transparent or semi-transparent plastic bag. ※For stick-shaped items such as umbrellas measuring up to 1 m, bundle roughly three pieces together with string into a bunch.</p> <div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px;"> <p>Recycling of disused small home appliances</p> <p>Small home appliances can be placed into dedicated collection boxes set up in public facilities. For details, refer to the instructions on the back.</p> </div>	 <p>Dry batteries Fluorescent lamps and light bulbs Mercury thermometers Spray cans Lighters Cutting items</p> <p>○Use up the contents of lighters and spray cans. ○Wrap edges of cutting items in paper or rag to ensure safety for collection.</p> <p>Put them in a transparent or semi-transparent plastic bag. ※You can put a long straight tube fluorescent lamp in the paper case its replacement came in.</p>	 <p>Bicycles Futon Wardrobes Skis</p> <p>○To carry bulky waste directly to a waste disposal center, read the instructions on the back. ○To have bulky waste collected, call the following facility.</p> <div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px; background-color: #ffffcc;"> <p>Bulky Waste Collection Reservation Center Tel.643-5371 Calling accepted Monday through Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. 830 yen per item (up to five items per pickup)</p> </div>

Please put items in bags separated by category, and set them out for collection by 8:30 (7:00 a.m. for certain areas) on the collection service day. Collection is made as scheduled even on a public holiday. However, the collection service is not available on Saturdays, Sundays and during the year-end and New Year holidays.
